

## The Unchanging Sea

Film maker Bill Morrison found an old damaged film roll of *The Unchanging Sea*, a film that captures many stories of the sea. The imagery became the seed and backdrop for a music project together with Michael Gordon, who composed an ocean-like environment with a "slowly rolling piano and an orchestra that, like water, is swelling and dying away" (Gordon). It is a dream come true to perform this serene yet at the same time turbulent brand new piece together with the Seattle Symphony during the Seattle International Film Festival.

The powerful duo consisting of Japanese architect Tsuyoshi Tane (DGT) & technical director Yutaka Endo (LUFTZUG) made this magical installation for Citizen during Milan Design Week, Salone 2016. To me the installation, titled 'time is TIME', creates a space to experience our connected moments. In the presence of several thousand visitors coming to see the installation during the opening of Salone, the Fazioli 308 made the silver flakes shiver quietly.

A performance by Ema Yuasa (former dancer with the Nederlands Dans Theater) will bring to life a site-specific installation created with music, video and photographs in an existing old home on the boarder of the Noorderplantsoen. takes you to the boarder between theater and everyday life.
