Join me in celebrating the illustrious beginning of Spring at <u>The Merchant House</u> in the heart of Amsterdam. On March 29th & 30th, the gallery space will host <u>of Sound and Song 3</u>, a program of music in an intimate setting. The Dutch-Ukrainian composer <u>Maxim Shalygin</u> is the spotlighted composer this spring. I will be performing his intriguing 9 Preludes. Maxim wrote in his program note; "The Cycle 9 Preludes for piano is a very dear work for me, in which I first felt the subtle facets of deep sensuality, joy, love, and sadness. This is a cycle of musical monodrama for one pianist, where memories and illusions cover each other, mix and leave a varied aftertaste." I've chosen to pair this piece with a work by the American composer Charlemagne Palestine, one of the founders of the New York school of minimalist music. Join me for a moving musical journey at The Merchant House on March 29th or 30th. The performance will evolve from soft and minimal sounds to culminate in a passionate climax.

Delirium for 4 Pianos by <u>Maxim Shalygin</u> is coming back. Delirium is an intense and very multifaceted work. As I mentioned last month, it holds a certain undeniable quality that draws you in and demands your full attention. Shalygin created this piece during the war in his country of birth. With each performance, I continue to discover new depths of emotion within the music. Working with Shalygin consistently reveals the powerful connection I have with his artistic vision.

The performance is scheduled for March 10th in Vlissingen, followed closely by another on April 12th in The Hague. Alongside my fellow performers: <u>Antonii Baryshevskyi</u>, <u>Gerard Bouwhuis</u>, and <u>Laura Sandee</u>, we are thrilled to bring you Delirium once more.

I realized how deeply impacted this piece is by the experience of war. This realization made me see how profoundly these conflicts affect us all. Even though we may feel powerless to stop the immediate conflict, perhaps, the urge to react and speak out against them will remain strong. No one is free, until we are all free.
