Two Legends



We ended up drinking and chatting all afternoon at the Ysbreeker, the former mecca of contemporary music along the Amstel river. I was intrigued and bluntly asked him if he could write me a new composition. That is how 'The Memory of Roses' was created.

On the 5th of June, I will perform this lovely piece again at the concert's opening. It will be an emotional evening because we still miss having these geniuses around. Louis had an immense quality as a composer, a human being, and a cultural leader in society. He always took the time to invest in the new generations.
