
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WE ARE THE HOUSE@Holland Festival coming up


Thriving WE ARE THE HOUSE in Kyoto

With WE ARE THE HOUSE being a new format to our repertoire, we had the honour of officially launching it in Kyoto, Japan during the last weeks. Together with activist <u>Rebecca Gomperts</u>, artist <u>Noa Jansma</u>, and filmmaker <u>Kiriko Mechanicus</u> we welcomed visitors for ten days straight and shared the stage with thirteen regional partners, including local communities, artists, scholars, students, and children. My most valuable takeaway? Even though we explored sensitive topics such as taboos, familial relationships, and gender roles, I never once felt an imbalance in hierarchy between us, the outsiders, and the local voices. The exchange was horizontal and generous. We didn't take many photos, but honestly, a camera would have created distance and that would have felt out of place given the intimate nature of the work.

A new short film





"kokokara" ("from here") is a short art film featuring the piano piece " 9 Preludes " (2005) by <u>Maxim Shalygin</u>. Maxim wrote the piece when he was just twenty years old. It expresses fragility and violence, emotions that now reflect what's happening in his homeland, Ukraine. The film, however, was shot on Aogashima, a remote volcanic island in Japan with no coastline, only steep cliffs. It also portrays the sacred fire of Oto Matsuri (fire feast), a 1,400-year-old ritual performed only by men and held every year in Kumano, the place where I grew up. The fire becomes a powerful symbol, connecting past and present, the sacred and the ordinary, as well as masculine and feminine energy. In the final scene, even my piano goes up in flames. The line between ritual and destruction begins to blur. "kokokara" is about the power of fire, the role of tradition, and the limits of art in the face of realworld violence, like the fires now burning in Gaza.
